New on the map — pizza on the prom and a pub garden pint

The world is opening up again and we've got everything you need to know

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In Ratho The Bridge Inn's canalside beer garden has had a revamp

The redevelopment of the Portobello promenade in Edinburgh into an alfresco food hub continues with the opening of a new Civerinos pizza bar. [Prom Slice](#) does what it says on the tin, selling New York-style pizza by the slice to take away or enjoy on a deckchair overlooking the North Sea. Once restrictions ease there will be an indoor seating area for 20.

The pizzeria is housed in a Miami-inspired pink and white building, where it will serve smoothies and breakfast pizzas in the morning, and frozen margaritas at sunset. It is the latest venture to come to the area, joining the popular street food van belonging to the Little Chartroom's Portobello pop-up.

Meanwhile, with a couple of days to go until the hospitality sector reopens after four months, pubs and restaurants are gearing up for a busy spring. Just in time, a new app has mapped beer gardens and allows patrons to alert friends to their whereabouts and invite them for a pint. [Bevvi](#) covers all of the UK, including Glasgow, where it highlights dozens of licensed outdoor drinking spaces, such as the southside's [Church on the Hill](#), the east end's [West on the Green](#) and the west end's [Brel](#). New beer gardens in the city include Mitchell Street's [Tingle](#) bar, which has an undercover cocktail terrace. In Ratho the [Bridge Inn](#)'s canalside beer garden has had a revamp, while in Elie a barbecue menu will be offered at the [Ship Inn](#)'s beachside garden. Other venues with outdoor seating opening on Monday are the roadstop-friendly [Real Food Café](#) in Tyndrum and [Balgove Larder](#)'s steak barn, just outside of St Andrews.
